1. Project Description

Appointment of a service provider to Conduct Medical Surveillance throughout the entire Joburg Market.

2. Background

Joburg Market is a pivotal wholesale marketplace located in City Deep, Johannesburg, specializing in the trading of fresh produce. It serves as a crucial hub for farmers, traders, and buyers, facilitating the distribution and sale of fruits, vegetables, and related products.

In terms of hygiene assessment or medical surveillance requirements at Joburg Market, the following key aspects should be considered:

- **Hygiene Standards:** Given that Joburg Market deals with perishable goods like fruits and vegetables, maintaining high hygiene standards is paramount. This includes regular inspections of facilities, handling practices, and storage areas to ensure cleanliness and compliance with health regulations.
- **Food Safety Protocols:** The market must adhere to strict food safety protocols to prevent contamination and ensure the quality of the produce. This involves monitoring the handling, storage, and transportation of goods to minimize risks associated with foodborne illnesses.
- **Worker Health and Safety:** Joburg Market require medical surveillance for its employees to monitor their health status, in particular, those that are involved in handling food products.
- **Environmental Health Concerns:** Assessments should extend to environmental health factors such as waste management, pest control, and water quality as these factors have an impact on both the quality of the produce and the health of workers and customers.
- **Compliance and Regulation:** Joburg Market operates under health regulations and standards, which dictate the requirements for hygiene assessment and medical surveillance.

3. SCOPE OF WORK

The scope of the assessment will cover the following items:

- i. Noise levels
- ii. Illumination levels
- iii. Ventilation levels
- iv. Employees exposure to airborne contaminations
- v. Types of hazards or exposures to be evaluated (chemical, biological, physical, ergonomic, etc.).
- vi. Frequency and duration of assessments or surveillance activities.

6. FUNCTIONALITY EVALUATION

The bidders who complied administratively are considered for further evaluation on ability to execute the project.

The assessment of functionality will be done in terms of the evaluation criteria and minimum threshold as specified. A bid will be disqualified if it fails to meet the minimum threshold for functionality as per the bid invitation.

NB! The minimum cut off points for functionality is 80 points out of 100 points and any bidder scoring less than 80 points will not be considered for further evaluation.

PREFERENCE POINTS CLAIM FORM IN TERMS OF THE PREFERENTIAL PROCUREMENT REGULATIONS 2022

This preference form must form part of all tenders invited. It contains general information and serves as a claim form for preference points for specific goals.

1. GENERAL CONDITIONS

1.1 The following preference point systems are applicable to invitations to tender:

- the 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value of up to R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included); and
- the 90/10 system for requirements with a Rand value above R50 000 000 (all applicable taxes included).

a) The applicable preference point system for this tender is the 80/20 preference point system.

1.2 Points for this tender (even in the case of a tender for income-generating contracts) shall be awarded for:

- (a) Price; and
- (b) Specific Goals.

1.3 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.

1.4 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

2. DEFINITIONS

- (a) **“tender”** means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation to provide goods or services through price quotations, competitive tendering process or any other method envisaged in legislation;
- (b) **“price”** means an amount of money tendered for goods or services, and includes all

applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts;

- (c) “**rand value**” means the total estimated value of a contract in Rand, calculated at the time of bid invitation, and includes all applicable taxes;
- (d) “**tender for income-generating contracts**” means a written offer in the form determined by an organ of state in response to an invitation for the origination of income-generating contracts through any method envisaged in legislation that will result in a legal agreement between the organ of state and a third party that produces revenue for the organ of state, and includes, but is not limited to, leasing and disposal of assets and concession contracts, excluding direct sales and disposal of assets through public auctions; and
- (e) “**the Act**” means the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000).

3.1. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

4. POINTS AWARDED FOR SPECIFIC GOALS

- 4.1. In terms of Regulation 4(2); 5(2); 6(2) and 7(2) of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, preference points must be awarded for specific goals stated in the tender. For the purposes of this tender the tenderer will be allocated points based on the goals stated in table 1 below as may be supported by proof/ documentation stated in the conditions of this tender:
- 4.2. In cases where organs of state intend to use Regulation 3(2) of the Regulations, which states that, if it is unclear whether the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system applies, an organ of state must, in the tender documents, stipulate in the case of—
- (a) an invitation for tender for income-generating contracts, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the highest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system; or
 - (b) any other invitation for tender, that either the 80/20 or 90/10 preference point system will apply and that the lowest acceptable tender will be used to determine the applicable preference point system, then the organ of state must indicate the points allocated for specific goals for both the 90/10 and 80/20 preference point system.

 - (c) cancel the contract and claim any damages which it has suffered as a result of having to make less favourable arrangements due to such cancellation;
 - (d) recommend that the tenderer or contractor, its shareholders and directors, or only the shareholders and directors who acted on a fraudulent basis, be restricted from obtaining business from any organ of state for a period not exceeding 10 years, after the *audi alteram partem* (hear the other side) rule has been applied; and
