ECONOMIC VICTIM OF COVID-19 RE-INVENTS HIMSELF THROUGH JOBURG MARKET

Lehlohonolo Mphaka, 29, a Professional Chef runs a take-away-food outlet in Dube, Soweto. He has nine-years experience working as a Chef for top restaurants in Sandton and Midrand. When the restaurant industry became affected due to COVID -19, he was retrenched.

"I didn't know what to do. I saw my world crumbling, just when I had recently got married, and my career flourishing. I was enjoying this trade of cooking meals for people, then COVID-19 came. We were told to pack-and-go, and once payment from the Unemployment Insurance Fund (UIF) came through we would be informed..."

"After the hard-lockdown I used my package to venture on my own, and started by buying a wendy -house, cooking equipment and a fridge. I set up shop and it is now five month, running well.

I buy 16 bags of Potatoes, 3-4 bags of Tomatoes, Onions and Luttice weekly at the Joburg Market. I sell Burgers, Chips, Dagwoods, Kotas (bunny-chow), Worsrolls, Chicken, Ribs, Salads,etc, on a take-away basis."

"The business is doing well, and his busiest days are Fridays and Saturdays when queues become long, well into late-evenings. My wife assists me

on those busy days, so we are growing. I now feel this was a blessing-in-disguise. **I rely on Joburg Market** so much such that when I am unable to come myself to buy I ask a nearby fresh-produce trader to stock for me because I am always busy at this joint," concludes Lehlogonolo.

THE SUDDEN PRICE-INCREASE OF TOMATOES EXPLAINED



In a video on *Landbou.com* Dr Johnny Van der Merwe, MD of agricultural information group Agrimark Trends (AMT), said that a record price of R16.82 per kilogram was reached on the market by mid-March, while high - quality tomato prices breached R30/kg.

This has resulted in a supply shock, pushing tomato prices higher by 47% in a single week by mid-March.

This was due to very scarce supplies given the "high and constant rainfall" in the northern parts of South Africa, which caused damage to harvests.

In an interview with 702, Clive Garrett, Marketing Manager of

the tomato producer ZZ2, also said their farms in Polokwane and Moeketsi were mostly affected water damage, which contributed to the short supply of carrots, with prices rocketing to R5.89 per kilo by mid -March.

Some production areas received more rain in January and February this year than they usually would in a year.


